Applicants must be Juniors, Seniors, or Graduate students and have a minimum 2.8 GPA. Ability and desire to work with people on the Autism Spectrum is a must. General responsibilities include, but are not limited to, researching potential employment opportunities for our clients, developing databases of potential donors and employers, and assisting with the planning and implementation of various activities that the organization arranges or participates in (including participation in community festivities).

Work hours: 20 – 40 hours a week according to an agreed-upon schedule with student, sponsor(s) at college or university, and assigned supervisor at Asperger Works

Duration: One semester (may be extended through agreement between student, school, and onsite supervisor)

Salary or other compensation: This is a non-paying position. Compensation provided is a grade and credits (per college guidelines) and the satisfaction of making a difference in people's lives.

Education requirements:

Grade-point average of 2.8 or above,

Junior, Senior, or Graduate student of good standing at the sponsoring college or university,
Basic knowledge of MS Office and database development and maintenance; other computer-related skills

Fluent command of the English language; fluency in Spanish a plus

Training/Professional Development: Students will be trained in event organization, data development, needs assessment, and public speaking. Additional learning opportunities will be provided according to the demands of our organization at a particular time.

Travel requirements: Interns may be asked to participate in visibility opportunities (i.e. community fairs, festivals, and parades), which may require some travel. But ownership of a vehicle is not required and other transportation possibilities (like ride-sharing) will be offered as needed.
